**IT AIN'T EASY BEING GREEN-
 Summer-Time Debt Busting and Saving Edition**

As mentioned in the previously written blurb, it is summer. This season more than any other, we are out spending money on clothing, and activities, doing all we can to experience the warmth and sunshine before we transcend back into the depths of cold. Though it is always encouraged to experience this day and any other to its fullest, it is also equally important to secure your finances so that you can continue to live well. Living well is great, but being financially secure to live better is greater. Often times, before we can start saving as we want, we must address the big D – our Debt.

Debt is a word most of us know too well. Be it from paying for school, paying our phone bill, over drafting at the bank, using that credit card when we know we shouldn't, or paying some other necessary expense, it is a day to day experience for many. We all have different ways of dealing with our debt. Some of us do the right thing and pay when possible, some of us ignore that we have debt, some of us minimize how bad our debt is, and some of us go into full denial of having debt. Many of these instances lead to those friendly phone calls from companies and the collections agencies that result in numerous wounds to our credit.

But why let it get to this extent? Like in other areas of our personal lives, it is important to take control of your financial state since this is the only way to craft it in the manner you find most desirable. Since we are simply focusing on ways to take control of our financial statuses, for this edition we will ignore the difference between good and bad debt. To assist me with this editions round of finance tips, I have elicited the assistance of financial guru Suzie Orman who has offered a lot of great tips and tricks to help those with the worst debt to lessen their burden. Here are a few brief tips to get you started on your journey to financial security:

1. **Wake up and Face the Music** – Admit you have debt and Take Action.

Before you can handle a situation, you first have to admit you have it. If you begin to feel like your debt is getting out of control and that you can no longer handle it, contact the person you have debt with. Though it is difficult, imagine the company as a friend, someone you have a close personal relationship with. If you friend leant you money or if there was a problem, wouldn't the most courteous thing be to contact them and let them know you won't be able to repay this money on time? Like this friend, companies are often a lot more understanding and likely to work with you if you keep them informed. If you avoid them, like all problems, the situation will always get worse.

Quick Tip: If you can't pay a bill or have an extensive overdraft, ask about payment plans and extension options. These can assist in avoiding extra fees and damage to your credit.

2. **Seek and destroy** – Get rid of all your credit cards except one.

If you have more than one credit card, cut up all but one. In doing so, this will lessen the likelihood you will use them again after you pay down debt. The one credit card can serve for emergency purposes and minimal use. Also, timely payments can assist in developing good credit. You can continue to make payments on your destroyed credit card via mail or by setting up a payment service through your online banking account.

If you have a debit card, as most of us do, but you find yourself often over drafting, cut this up too! There was life before these came into existence. Sometimes it is necessary to get back to the basics as in going into the bank to get your money to assist in regaining control. If you decide to keep your debit card, carry \$10-20 with you for small purchases and only use your card for larger purchases.

Quick Tip: Don't forget to log all purchases made with your debit card and log all withdrawals, outstanding checks, and deposits to your checking and savings accounts. When making purchases

with your debit card, it can take up to 10 days (if not longer) for it to actually post to your account. If you have made an error somewhere, you just earned yourself an overdraft fee of \$25-35 depending on the bank.

To make it easy on yourself, keep the receipt from each purchase made throughout the day. At the end of the day, tally the totals to determine your balances and to ensure your accounts are still in the green.

Don't be afraid to take control. Not only is this your money – this is your life.

PARENTING THE HEAT IS ON!!

Keeping kids entertained during the summer months can be exhausting, especially with the temperatures rising. But just as important as it is to make sure our little ones get plenty of exercise through playtime is to know how to keep them safe and healthy in hot, sunny weather.

One way to prevent heat related illnesses is to keep our children (and ourselves!) hydrated. *Dehydration* is a condition that occurs when someone loses more fluids than he or she takes in, and in the hot summer heat, this loss usually occurs through excessive sweat. Common signs of dehydration include *fatigue* and *irritability* – so if you are out with your child and he or she seems to act suddenly crabby or sluggish, get him or her out of the heat and something to drink as soon as possible. It is important to remember that we do not always have to wait until our child asks for something to drink before offering it. Many times, we do not know we are thirsty until we are already starting to get dehydrated!!

When loading up on fluids to stay cool, it's best to stick with water. If your child insists on juice, try diluting it by mixing 1/4 cup of juice to 3/4 cups of water. Most sodas and teas contain caffeine, which actually makes the body lose fluids, rather than keep them in. So reserve sodas for treats and special occasions, and hydrate with water or small amounts of naturally sweetened fruit juices.

The amount of liquid children need depends on the heat, degree of activity, and how long they play outside. To ensure your child is getting enough water, offer it at least 6 times a day, *even if they are not thirsty!!* When playing outdoors, ensure your child has a full bottle of cool water, and encourage him or her to occasionally take a break and have a sip. When you are traveling around outside in the summer heat, always make sure to pack some fluids for a quick boost!

The summertime is a great time to spend precious moments with your children outside. Summer can be full of great activities, adventures, slides, and swings. They will remember these days for a lifetime, so make sure that they enjoy the outdoors safely, happily, and healthfully. Drink up, and have a great time!
